

Authors reply: defense of taxonomy, a Sisyphus task?

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Dear Editor:

We appreciate the contribution of Prof. Dr. Carlos Marcondes Brisola to the article entitled *Eclectic feeding behavior of Lutzomyia (Nyssomyia) intermedia (Diptera, Psychodidae, Phlebotominae) in the transmission area of American cutaneous leishmaniasis, State of Paraná, Brazil*¹. In response to the questions raised by Prof. Carlos, we wish to emphasize that, although the authors¹ and other researchers² consider and know the importance of other taxonomic proposals published thus far, we chose to use the taxonomic key proposed by Young & Duncan³ deeming it fit to be applicable to our research.

Further, we would like to mention that adopting the key by the above authors for reference did not demerit and/or disrespect the contributions by other authors^{4,5}, since an author can adopt any approach for study depending on his/her needs.

Lastly, we believe that the Journal of the Brazilian Society of Tropical Medicine prioritizes professionalism concerning their publications, which includes a philosophy ruled by rectitude and democracy, seeking distinctness on the knowledge of disclosure.
