## **GUILLAIN-BARRÉ SYNDROME AND DENGUE**

Dear Sir.

The publication on Guillain-Barré syndrome and dengue is very interesting<sup>1</sup>. Indeed, Guillain-Barré syndrome can be present as a totally unwanted event in any viral infection. However, the direct causal relationship between Guillain-Barré syndrome and dengue required further systematic corroboration. An interesting concern is that there is no confirmed exclusion of other factors that can lead to Guillain-Barré syndrome in the reported cases, including the present one. Also, SOARES *et al.* noted that the case of Guillain-Barré syndrome is usually detectable in asymptomatic or oligosymptomatic dengue infection, but not in overt cases<sup>2</sup>. The emergence of Guillain-Barré syndrome in dengue might be reclassified as new "dengue neurological demyelinating polyradiculoneuropathy"<sup>3</sup>.
