## REF.: THE BIOLOGICAL MEANING OF ANTI-HBc POSITIVE RESULT IN BLOOD DONORS: RELATION TO HBV-DNA AND TO OTHER SEROLOGICAL MARKERS

Dear Editor,

In the original article **"The biological meaning of anti-HBc positive result in blood donors: relation to HBV-DNA and to other serological markers"** published in May-June 2003<sup>2</sup>, the authors stated that "a recent study shows a high prevalence of anti-HBc (16%) in blood donors" and referred our paper (ALMEIDA NETO *et al.*, 2001)<sup>1</sup>. Actually, we have not studied the prevalence of this marker in blood donors. We did find 16% of false-positive results after retesting 112 isolated anti-HBc seropositive blood donors.
